

## **Old Testament Readings for Funeral Mass**

1. **C0 - Ecclesiastes 3:1-15** (or *short version 1-8*): *There is an appointed time for everything, and a time for every affair under heaven.*
2. **C1 - 2 Maccabees 12:43-46**: *He acted in an excellent and noble way as he had the resurrection of the dead in view.*
3. **C2 - Job 19:1, 23-27a**: *I know that my Vindicator lives.*
4. **C3 - Wisdom 3:1-9** (or *short version 3:1-6, 9*): *As sacrificial offerings he took them to himself.*
5. **C4 - Wisdom 4:7-15**: *An unsullied life, the attainment of old age.*
6. **C5 - Isaiah 25:6a, 7-9**: *He will destroy death forever.*
7. **C6 - Lamentations 3:17-26**: *It is good to hope in silence for the saving help of the Lord.*
8. **C7 - Daniel 12:1-3**: *Many of those who sleep in the dust of the earth shall awake.*

### **\*\*During Easter Season ONLY\*\***

1. **C8 - Acts of the Apostles 10:34-43**: (or *short version 10:34-36, 42-43*): *He is the one appointed by God as judge of the living and the dead.*
2. **C9 - Revelation 14:13**: *Blessed are the dead who die in the Lord.*
3. **C10 - Revelation: 20:11-21:1**: *The dead were judged according to their deeds.*
4. **C11 - Revelation 21:1-5a, 6b-7**: *There shall be no more death.*

it was a holy and pious thought.**

freed from this sin.**

with the Holy Spirit and power.**

**They put him to death by hanging him on a tree.**

**This man God raised on the third day and granted that he be
